Quality of Care

The Chinese health care system is currently undergoing a gradual transformation, from socialized health care to a system that includes privately-run facilities aiming to meet international standards. Although the system is rapidly evolving, travelers encounter a situation similar to that in other countries in Asia: abundant facilities in urban areas providing adequate care, but rural areas that are underserved, often offering only rudimentary medical facilities short on supplies and well trained staff.

The largest cities—including Shanghai, Beijing, and Shenzhen—have health care facilities capable of treating most travelers with minor medical conditions. Elsewhere services are very basic and not recommended for travelers and visitors. For many travelers, international clinics are the best option, offering both inpatient care (often as a precursor to evacuation) and outpatient care in clean, Western-style facilities.

UnitedHealthcare Global recommends that travelers and foreign visitors seek care in private clinics in China's urban cities, preferably those staffed by Western-trained physicians. If care is unavailable from a private facility, the VIP wards of urban area hospitals should be able to provide adequate level of care and stabilization prior to evacuation. UnitedHealthcare Global recommends evacuation in cases of serious medical conditions or emergencies requiring invasive procedures, complex surgical interventions, or if prolonged hospitalization is required.

Travelers should note that medical training varies widely among doctors practicing in China. Doctors in rural areas may have only trained for three years; even in major cities, the duration and scope of study may not be up to Western standards. Other doctors may have trained in traditional Chinese medicine but have had little exposure to up-to-date Western medical practice.

Private transportation or a taxi may be the best option for travelers in need of emergency transportation due to the poor functioning of the public emergency system in China. Public ambulance services in major cities are better equipped to handle emergencies, although response times can vary between different neighborhoods in urban areas.

Travelers in Beijing may also dial 999, which will access the emergency services of the Beijing Red Cross. This service has a smaller presence in the city than the 120 service and is not available in other parts of the country.

In the case of an emergency, go IMMEDIATELY to the nearest physician or hospital without delay, then notify UnitedHealthcare Global Assistance as soon as possible of your situation.
